

## ICS4ICS Exercise at GridSecCon Oct 17, 2023

## **Executive Summary**

Brian Peterson, ICS4ICS program manager, facilitated an ICS4ICS Exercise on Oct 17, 2023, at GridSecCon in Quebec City Canada. The exercise participants identified these recommendations:

- Provide hand-outs to ICS4ICS Exercise participants including Acronyms, org chart, Planning-P, etc. (2-sided page, possibly laminated)
- Acronyms should be moved earlier in the deck
- Case-studies would be valuable to help understand processes (mock-roles)
- ICS4ICS should be presented at the larger group of the conference
  - o A request to present to conference participants was not accepted
- Need to present ICS4ICS training at GRIDEx and potentially integrate ICS4ICS exercise materials into the GRIDEx exercise materials
  - Submitted proposal to integrated ICS4ICS into GRIDEx at their next (2025) exercise
- Help people understand the "WHY" asset owners should deploy the ICS4ICS program at their companies
- Describe how staff working in operations often must work with Cyber Incident Response and ICS4ICS efforts
  - They can't perform operations work at the same time as Cyber Incident Response work
  - Mutual aid may be needed to back-fill some roles at companies that have few people in each role

## Other Comments

These are other comments made by the exercise participants:

- Nice to have a little background on how the ICS4ICS program leveraged NIMS/ICS materials and describing their history from the 1970's
- Appreciated hearing about the future of ICS4ICS program and how to get involved in the program
- The structure of the ICS4ICS program is good including merging concepts of cyber-physical and NIMS/ICS
- Ransomware and other processes presented during the ICS4ICS exercise were valuable
- Linkage between the Planning-P steps in the exercise and the ICS4ICS documented (procedures) processes was valuable and should be added to more documents
